Argentina is at a pivotal moment in its energy transition, actively working to expand its renewable capacity and reduce its reliance on traditional sources. This national drive, combined with the country's incredible solar resources, creates a truly compelling landscape for investors and.

The country just crossed 7,133 MW of total renewable capacity as of May 2025, finally getting serious about clean energy. Solar accounts for nearly 20% of renewable generation, pumping out 446 GWh in November 2024 alone. Not bad for a sector that's been called "underdeveloped" by pretty much.

PVTIME – Argentina is set to open its landmark 1GW solar panel manufacturing plant, which is operated by the provincial energy firm Empresa Provincial Societaria del Estado (EPSE). Located in San Juan Province, near the Andes, EPSE will oversee the facility's expansion from initial panel production.

The project is part of an ambitious plan that seeks to boost local production of renewable technology, reduce dependence on imports, and promote economic development with a sustainable perspective. The initiative **is led by a state energy company** that, for years, has made the sun its main.
