Will Nio open a battery swap station in Belgium?

Electric vehicle maker Nio is preparing to open its first battery swap station in Belgium, the company's Head of Power, Kajsa Sognefur, revealed in a livestream. The station will be Nio's first in a country where it does not sell cars, as the company accelerates the deployment of battery swap stations in Europe to over 50 locations.

Where is NIO's first battery swap station?

Nio opened its first battery swap station in Belgium on Thursday, marking the 59th in Europe. Located near Antwerp, it is the company's first station in a country where its vehicles are not yet available for sale. The station in Belgium was initially announced in late September by the company's head of Power, Kajsa Sognefur.
