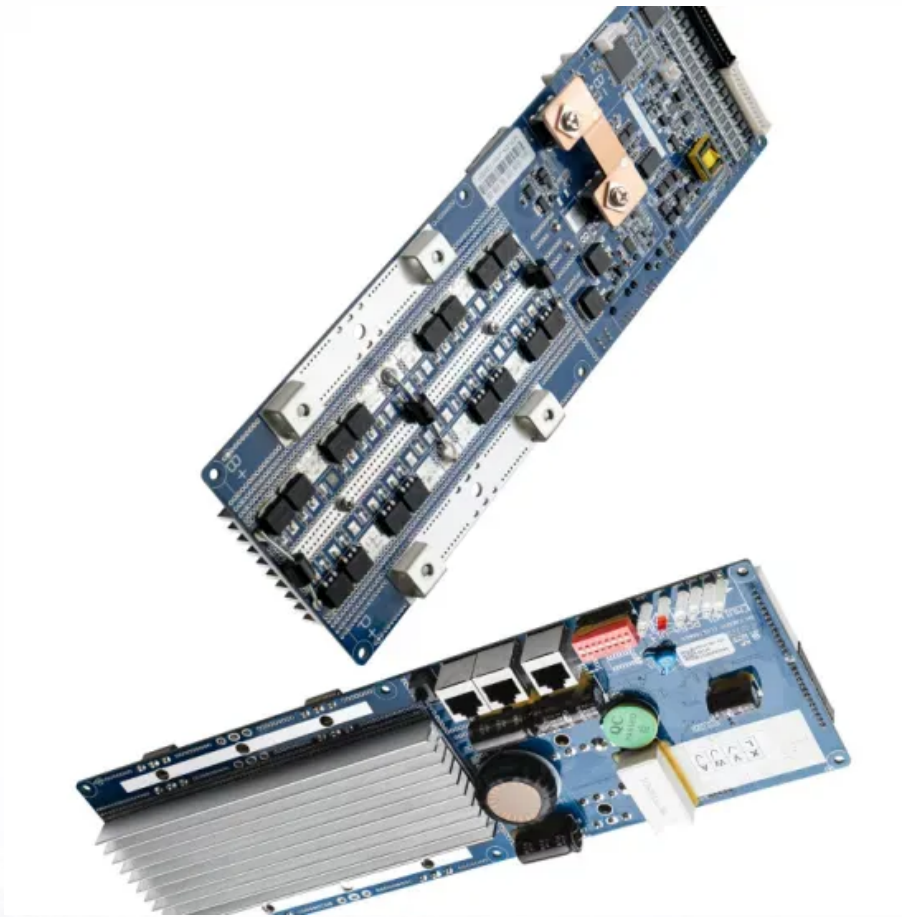

Can I bring a portable power bank to Guinea-Bissau



Overview

Yes, you can bring portable chargers and power banks in your carry-on. They must have lithium ion batteries under 100 watt hours (Wh), or about 26,800mAh. Do not pack these in checked luggage. Plug-in phone chargers without batteries can go in either carry-on or checked bags.

Portable chargers or power banks containing a lithium ion battery must be packed in carry-on bags. Spare lithium batteries, which include both power banks and phone chargers, are prohibited in checked luggage. For more information, see the FAA guidance on portable rechargers. For more prohibited.

If you're still asking, can you bring a portable charger on a plane?

The answer is yes, you can travel with most power banks. However, if you are concerned about your charger being seized or are generally anxious about the safety elements of being in the air, read on to learn the rules. Can I Take.

Passengers can bring spare lithium ion and lithium metal batteries, such as power banks and phone charging cases, in carry-on luggage only. With airline approval, you may carry up to two larger batteries (101–160 watt-hours or 2-8 grams). Always verify specific rules with your airline before.

This guide will help you understand TSA-approved guidelines, select the best power bank for your travel needs, and follow best practices to keep your devices powered up safely and efficiently. When choosing a travel-friendly

power bank, understanding mAh (milliamp-hour) ratings and charging.
