On September 6, 2024, the Federal Communications Commission (Commission or FCC) released Assessment and Collection of Regulatory Fees for Fiscal Year 2024; Review of the Commission's Assessment and Collection of Regulatory Fees, Assessment and Collection of Space and Earth Station Regulatory Fees.

Building and maintaining a communication base station is a complex process that involves various costs. These costs can be broadly categorized into two main categories: initial setup costs and ongoing maintenance costs. Let's explore these categories in detail. The initial setup costs are one-time.

The FCC collects regulatory fees and processing fees. Congress authorizes our authority to impose and collect such fees. Application processing fees are deposited in the U.S. Treasury and are not available to the FCC. Application Processing Fees for licenses, equipment approvals, antenna.

Sections 6 (a) and 9 (b) of the Communications Act, as amended, require the Commission to assess and collect regulatory fees every fiscal year to recover the Commission's costs of carrying out its functions. These functions include enforcement activities, policy and rulemaking activities, user.
