By 2017, Italy had built over 730 000 solar power plants with a total capacity of 19.7 GW, bringing the figure close to 8%. The capacity surpassed 20 GW in 2018, and the "National Energy Strategy," or SEN, announced in 2017 stated a goal of 50 GW by 2030.

In 2010, The Montalto di Castro Photovoltaic Power Station was completed and it is considered the largest photovoltaic power station in Italy with 85 MW solar capacity. Along with this largest PV power station, there are also other large PV plants like Cellino San Marco with 42.7 MW capacity, San.

That said, it is still true that solar energy in Italy basically means electric solar power, or photovoltaics. The other type, solar thermal generation, which uses sunlight to directly heat fluids (often water), does exist but does not account for a significant proportion. In fact, according to.

In Italy specifically, Enel has developed several landmark projects including the 84 MW Catania solar plant in Sicily and the innovative agrivoltaic project in Taranto that combines agriculture with solar energy production. Their 3Sun Gigafactory in Catania is set to become Europe's largest solar.

As part of its National Energy and Climate Plan (NECP), Italy aims to more than double its current installed solar PV capacity to 52 GW by 2030. Developers are capitalising on rising investor interest in utility-scale renewable assets, strong solar irradiance, and falling technology costs as the.
