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The Government of Uganda authorised the construction of a 100 MW solar photovoltaic plant with a 250 MWh battery energy storage system in Kapeeka. The facility will be developed by U.S.-based Energy America, with its East Africa subsidiary, EA Astrovolt, serving as lead project developer and.

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A US firm, Energy America, has announced plans to develop a 100 MWp solar power plant paired with a 250 megawatt hours (MWh) battery energy storage system (BESS) in Uganda. The firm made this known in an official statement on Monday, adding that the project will be located in Kapeeka Sub County.

The 24 MWp Ituka solar photovoltaic project will be the first solar PV project in the West Nile region. The project financing was secured during COP28 with Emerging Africa Infrastructure Fund. Dubai, United Arab Emirates; August 2nd, 2024: AMEA Power, one of the fastest-growing renewable energy.

Uganda has approved a major 100 MW solar project featuring a 250 MWh battery storage system.
